Work in Publishing - Cambridge University Press trip

We are delighted to be partnering with **Form the Future** during **Work in Publishing Week** and your child has expressed an interest in attending a publishing workshop and career carousel. The focus will be 'Thriving in a changing world' which is inspired by the skills that students think they need to succeed beyond school. The Cambridge University education team will work with 15 KSA students to explore how they can support young people to thrive in an unpredictable world.

Students will work in small teams to develop a product concept that uses gaming or virtual reality to develop essential 'future ready skills' such as self-management, leadership and communication. Working with colleagues from across product commissioning, digital product management and marketing, students will develop their ideas and pitch them to our expert panel.

Following this session, the ever-popular career carousel will give students the chance to meet a wide range of colleagues from across the organisation. Our colleagues will talk about what they did straight after school, what they are doing now, whether the qualifications they gained at school and beyond were relevant to their current role, and top tips on career development in their area.

Our aim is that students will work in teams and develop some of their own 'future-ready skills'. We want them to have a taste of working with diverse publishing experts, build confidence and feel supported to give a presentation to all participants by the end of the session. Students will also gain insights chatting with a wide range of professionals from Cambridge University, learning how their career paths evolved.
