EXT STEPS FOR THE SCHOOL (WE DID

Not having contact back when calling in.

We aim to respond to phone calls and emails received within two – five school days. We are developing an escalation system whereby if responses are not received within this time period you are able to escalate this so a senior leader with the principal also being informed.

Monitoring of the corridors during movement time We have enhanced our corridor patrols and have spoken to students about the respect agenda to younger students. We continue to monitor this issue.

Access to toilets

Students with medical needs will be issued with cards. If a child with a card needs to go to the toilet, then this must be respected. Unless it is an emergency, students have two breaks during the day to go to toilet.

More SEND provision

We have appointed three additional HLTA to support the expanding SEND needs just this term. We hope this will allow us to be able to reach out to more students. We are limited to resources and do need to prioritise at times.

More information on curriculum

We have set several targets to communicate even more about what your child is learning, including homework and what resources can be used to support them at home. This includes stretching the more able as well.

More support for neurodiverse students Like the student council, the group will have the opportunity to meet with the principal and other key members of staff every half term to discuss how as a school we become even more inclusive in all aspects of what we do.

More detailed academic reporting

We have committed to ensuring students and parents received detailed information about what topics and how we are assessing in Years 11 and Post116 throughout the year leading up to the final examinations. We aim to review the Attitude to Learning guidance this year and ensure subject evenings are impactful

YOU SAID ABOUT...

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
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Dear Post 16 Students and Parent / Carer,

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
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MOBILE PHONES REMINDER

I make no apology in continuing to remind students of the mobile phone ban across the school. Post 16 students retain the exclusive privilege of using their mobiles in their dedicated Common Room and Study Room but need to continue to be positive role models for the lower school by keeping their phones and headphones out of sight.



POST 16 ATTENDANCE AND PHONING IN SICK

We will be sending out a further set of letters to the parents/carers of any students whose attendance has remained below 90% over the course of this second half term. In many cases this will now result in those students being made parental entries, with the cost of their summer examinations being paid from home. If there have been genuine reasons we are not aware of, it is the responsibility of the students and their parents/carers to provide this information to the school. Students should be attending everyday unless there are exceptional circumstances. There is a huge correlation between low attendance and low attainment and in the sixth form, every lesson really does count!

I also wish to remind you that Post 16 students (or their parents/carers) must still phone in <u>every day</u> they are not in school. There is a dedicated Post 16 absence line which Miss Kingston checks and uses to inform staff students will be missing from lessons.



UCAS DEADLINE

The final deadline for students applying to university next year is 26 January 2022. However, Mr Walji will need UCAS applications sending to him the week before (19 January) so he can get the forms checked and references attached. This is a time-consuming process and I urge students to get everything done from their end before they return after Christmas.

POST 16 BURSARY

Another remainder of the availability of the P16 bursary fund. This is not just available to students in receipt of Free School Meals or from families receiving Universal Credit but to all families of Post 16 students in financial hardship. The bursary can provide for a range of educational support, including bus fares, educational visits, course textbooks equipment.
