How can we help?

Wellbeing support: We have three Wellbeing support mentors in school who can support students social, emotional, self esteem issues, if you feel your child would benefit from this please do get in touch using the wellbeing referrals form via out website https://www.kscs.org.uk/wellbeing-referral







Trainee Counsellors: Over the past year we have had three trainee counsellors working at Ken Stimpson as part of their university placement. Cristina, Hayley and Paulina will continue to work at the school and the feedback from students and staff who have used the service have found this beneficial. This service is only available to students aged 15 and over if we feel your child may be suitable for this, we will contact you to make you aware they will be meeting with one of the counsellors.

If your child is a Post 16 students, they can self-refer.

Head of Year/Student Support – For day to day concerns your head of year or student support officer are the best people to get in touch with. If you are concerned about any situation, please get in touch with them as soon as possible and we will do our best to resolve or clarify any situation.

Parenting Courses

Parents and Carers sometimes want or need extra help or information to better equip you to deal with parenting issues, although we are happy to support in any way we can Peterborough City Council over a variety of parenting courses to support you with parenting challenges. Mobile Phones

Mobile phones and technology continue to dominate the media regarding the misuse among young people. Please ensure you are checking your child's phone, for messages, chats, and photos.

If your child is in receipt of unkind messages or you are concerned with who they have been talking, please do get in touch with us.

If we suspect or have received information your child may be involved in some inappropriate mobile use, we will ask to look at their phone, if they refuse to allow us to look at it, we will contact you to come into school to share our concerns and for you to view it with us. We appreciate your support in this in keeping your child safe.

While there are many parental control apps to choose from, the standard choice is **Google Family Link**. Free to use, Google Family Link works with both Apple and Android devices.
