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# Another incredible year for Young Enterprise!

This year, our Young Enterprise team Invictus enjoyed an enormously successful year, becoming only the second Peterborough team since Ken Stimpson's own Dynasty in 2018 to reach the National Final!

Invictus produced a series of children's books for 6-9 year olds, helping children deal with key social issues. Benny the Bee focuses on bullying and Bella the Bear covers neurodivergence (autism). Both books come with a crocheted soft toy. The Area final took place at the University of East Anglia in Norwich. The semi-final was held virtually, and the team coped superbly with the challenges this presented, delivering a very impressive team interview over Zoom as well as a live presentation to the judges and online audience. 70 teams entered the Young Enterprise competition from the Eastern region, and Invictus came out came out on top, truly a remarkable achievement! We're very proud of you!





## **Stamford College Taster Sessions**

Year 9 and 10 students had a fantastic time at Stamford College in April. Various businesses supported the day by putting on taster sessions of different trades such as plumbing, electrics, plant machinery, technical engineering, tetrahedron, brick laying and carpentry. Students were hands on and made bird boxes, wired alarm systems for houses, maneuvered

small diggers, built brick walls, put guttering up, did health checks on cars and took part in many other skills-building activities.

Our students won seven awards during the day and Mrs Patman won Teacher of the Day! Well done all, and many thanks to all businesses and Stamford College for organising.

#### A Trip to Peterborough Cathedral

In the Spring, Year 7 students visited Peterborough Cathedral to enrich their studies of Tudor Society, Religious Studies and World Views. Students participated in a 'Tudors, Monks and Monarchs' workshop which saw them explore the Cathedral and understand what life would have been like for a monk at Peterborough Abbey during the Tudor Period. Students visited the tomb of Katherine of Aragon,

took part in costume role play, and learned the reasons behind the changes in the Church during the Tudor Times. Students also participated in a 'Faith, Worship and Belief' workshop where they learned about Christian worship, the key aspects of religions, especially the people, the stories and the traditions that influence the beliefs and values of others.

#### The Energy Quest Workshop

In April, students in Year 8 took part in an Energy Quest workshop, where they learned about the skills required in engineering careers and had the opportunity to put their own skills to the test in a range of activities!

The workshop is linked to the curriculum, and students learned about a range of sustainable energy sources and the role engineers play in green energy/sustainable technology. Also, how to generate energy, and how they can work as a team to respond to a challenge. Learning how their skills and interest can lead to a career in engineering was of particular interest.

The students did very well with the practical activity, which involved working out how to charge a phone using fruit and some small metal pieces! They also put forward some very creative ideas for the survival task, which the presenters were very impressed with!







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
