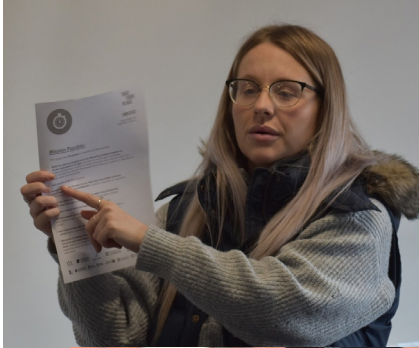
English, Maths and Science interventions during pastoral time are well underway and have been received well by students. These are extremely helpful in upskilling and increasing knowledge for students.

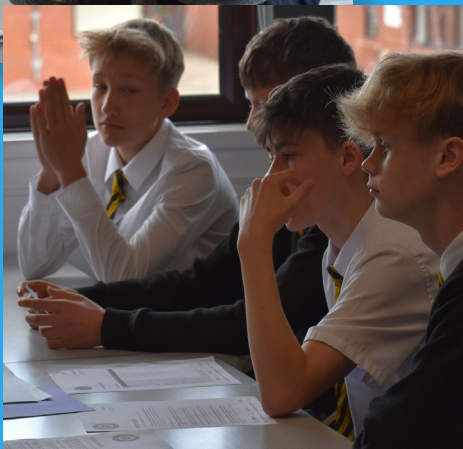
