The survey is now open and will close on Sunday 24 July at 12pm.

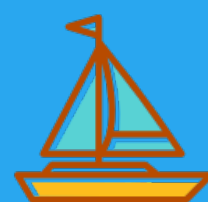

Your child/children have also been contacted with a similar survey via email and I encourage them to complete this feedback as well.

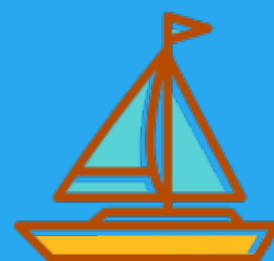

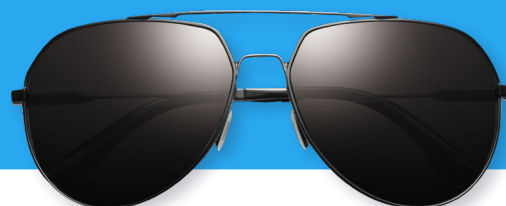
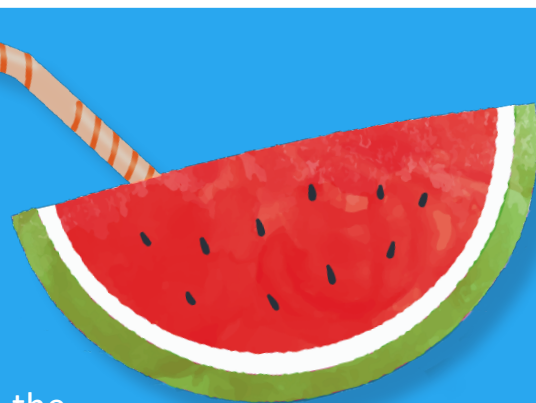
