- Translating a passage of minimum 100 words from French into English
- Translating a passage of minimum 100 words from English into French.

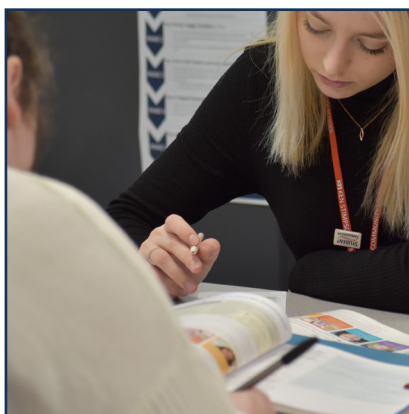
